Council maroons residents

Upper Lachlan Council has approved the construction of a low level culvert which will leave some residents marooned in the event of a flood.

The culvert will replace the 100 year old wooden bridge the Council has already partially demolished, without the public consultation required under Section 29 of the NSW Roads Act.

Collector residents have received independent advice that, unlike the former bridge, the low level culvert will prevent their escape from floods. An anabranch of the creek which forms on the lowest section of Murray Street between the town and houses to the south, will block the road during floods. The bridge previously provided an escape route, but the new culvert will be underwater during serious floods. In response to the advice

received by the residents, Upper Lachlan Council commissioned a supplementary report on flooding over the two proposed culvert structures. The Council's new report, however, used previous flood data which the consultants conceded was insufficient to predict the nature of specific flooding events. The consultant's caveats means legal liability, in the event of flooding, will remain with the Council.

The Council has repeatedly advised that it has only \$220,000 to spend and this culvert is all it can afford. Collector residents, however, point out the Council is spending hundreds of thousands of dollars more than this on numerous bridges which are located near to where Upper Lachlan Councillors live, this financial year. They believe the Council is selling Collector short and are appealing to the State Government to intervene.
