Collector locals in bid to save bridge

COLLECTOR residents are drawing on Governor Lachlan Macquarie in their ongoing protest over a local bridge.

The Save Collector Creek group claims Upper Lachlan Shire Council is feeding false information to the NSW Heritage Office about the structure.

They asked the Office to impose an interim heritage order on the 110-year-old timber bridge in June and called for all works to stop until an independent assessment of the structure's heritage, safety and environmental issues was carried out.

The council wants to demolish the bridge to overcome what they say are flooding problems and replace it with a series of concrete box culverts.

"Upper Lachlan Council has fed false information to the NSW Heritage Office so it can build a low-level culvert with 200 metres of road works where Governor Lachlan Macquarie camped and named Lake George on October 27, 1820," the group said in a statement.

Residents claimed that following a council meeting and site inspection on June 18, the Heritage Office found that "the change to the level of the paved road surfaces to the new crossing would be negligible".

"This is contradicted by Council's own Collector Bridge Options Paper of December 2009 (recently ratified)," a group spokesperson said.

"This states the culvert will be 1.47 metres below the deck of the current bridge, the earth ramparts of the bridge in front of adjacent

houses will be lowered by a similar amount and road lowering will continue for 100 metres either side. To call this 'negligible' is therefore grossly dishonest and misleading."

They claimed the Council was giving one story to the Heritage Office and another in its own operational documents.

"It is hoping to get away with a cheap culvert which trashes Macquarie's legacy while it is spending hundreds of thousands of dollars on a number of other bridges in the Shire which are closer to its councillors," the spokesperson said.

"That the Shire derives its name from Macquarie and it is doing it on his bicentenary in Australia is all the more shameful."

However, the council's director of works and operations, Phil Newham said the interim heritage order had been dismissed and the group had received correspondence to this effect. (This is not the group's understanding).

He said residents were referring to road heights in an old document.

"The new document proposes to lower the height by 600mm for a very

short length (50 metres either side of the bridge), which is insignificant," Mr Newham said.

"The problem at the moment is that bridge sits up higher than the road so that when it floods, people can't access it. We'll reduce the height to lessen the damming effect."

The work is estimated to cost \$225,000 and is a "commonsense" solution given the \$650,000 to \$1 million price tag for a new bridge, according to the council.

"We don't have the money to build a new one," Mr Newham said.

He confirmed Heritage Office advice that Governor Macquarie had camped nearby, but said the bridge wasn't even there at that time.

"It has no significance other than it is old and it's at Collector," Mr Newham said.

He described it as a generic type and several other similar ones had been demolished in the Shire in recent months.

Decking has been removed from the Collector structure and the council was awaiting NSW Department of Fisheries documentation to gain access to the underside. Demolition is expected to be complete by the end of July.

A spokesperson for the NSW Heritage Office declined to respond to detailed questions. She would only say the Office was considering the request (interim order) and was "actively looking into the issue."
